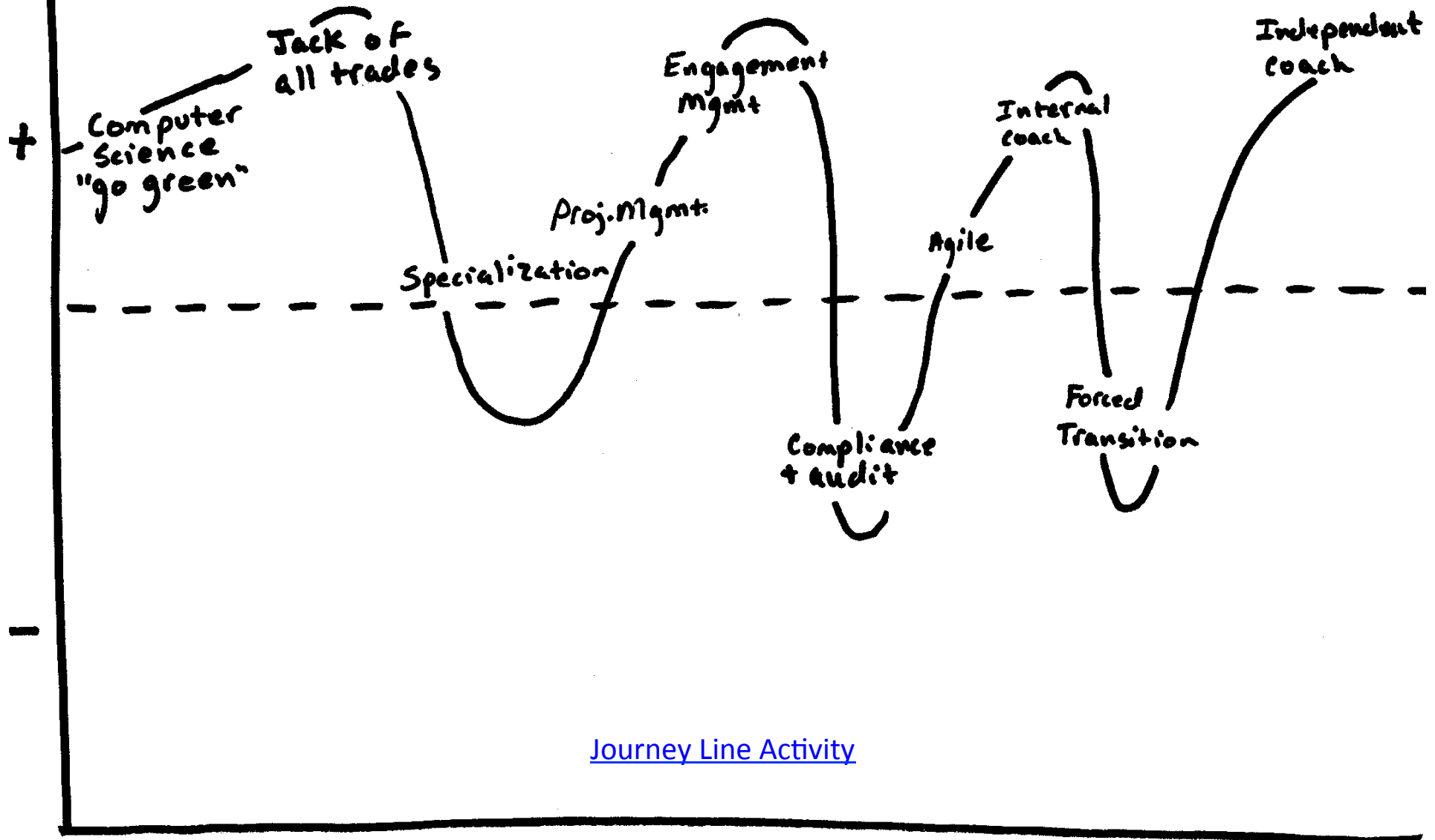

Working software is the primary measure of progress.

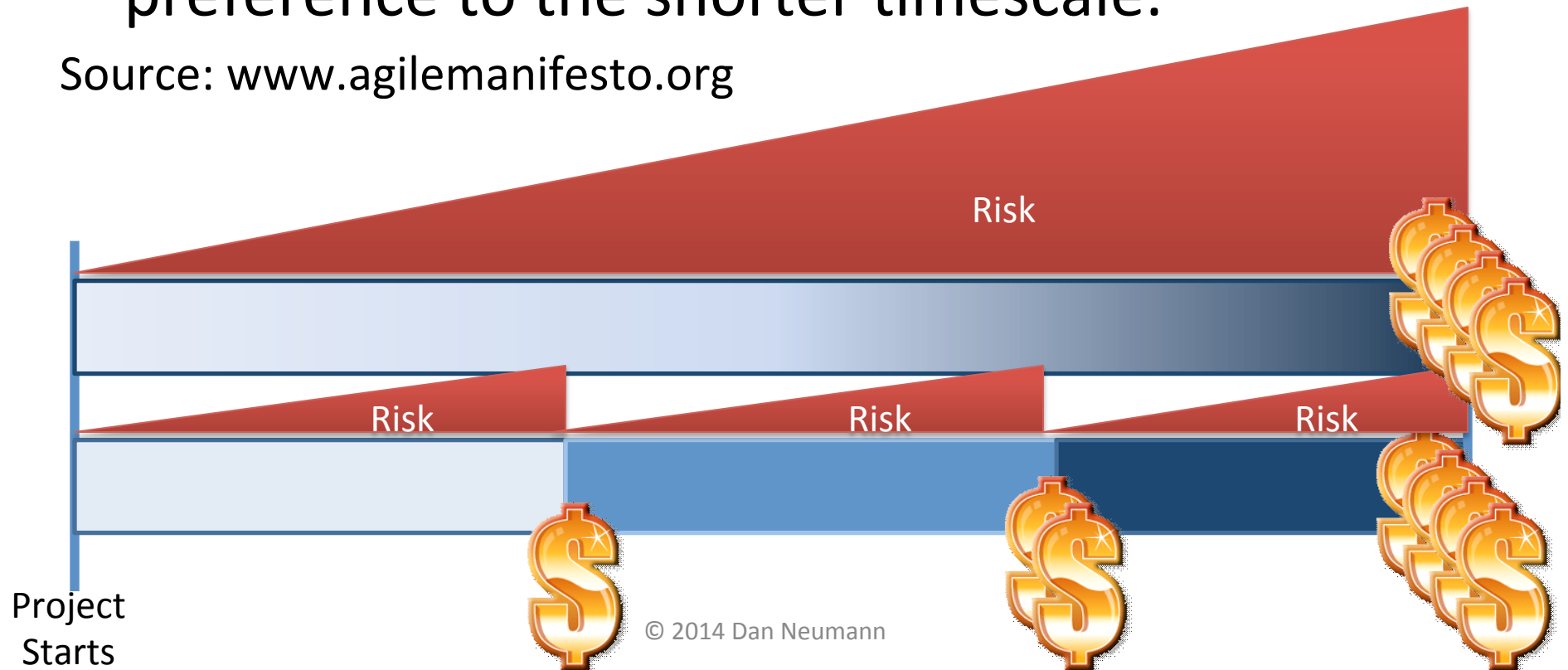

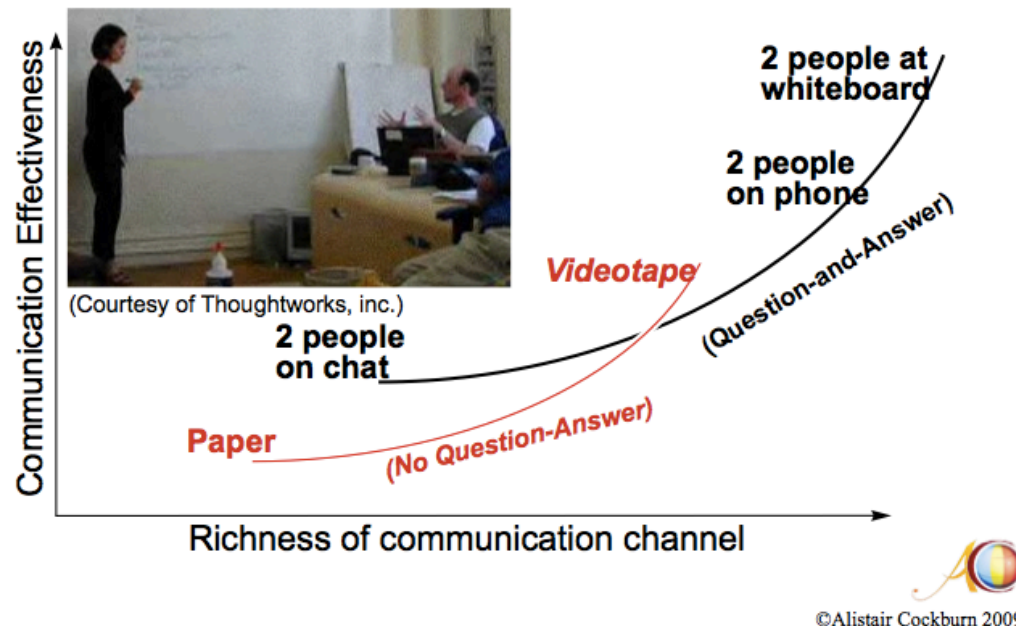

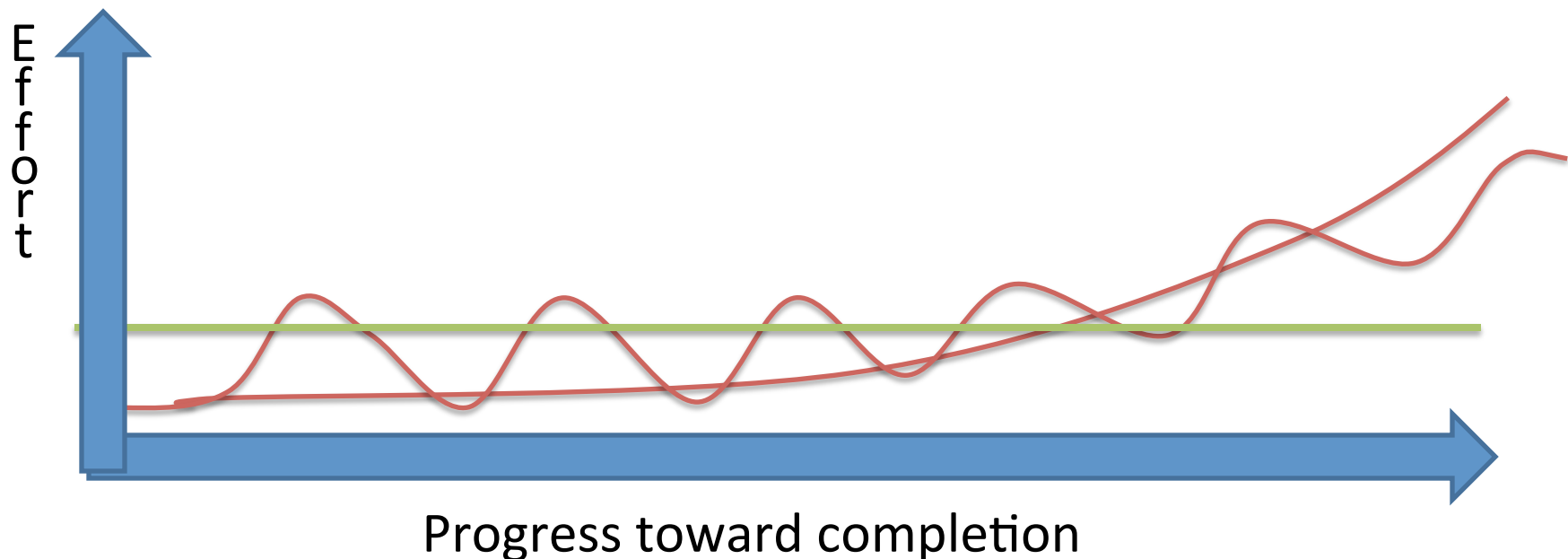

Simplicity--the art of maximizing the amount of work not done--is essential.

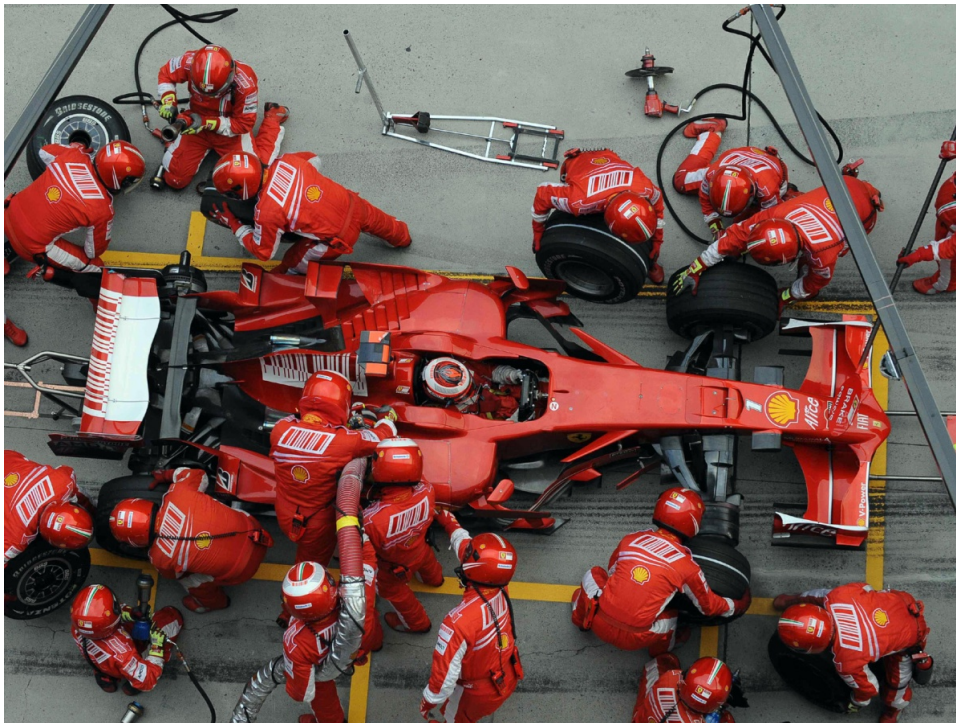
